Recycle Center is now located in the connexes behind the CIV Office. All electronic waste needs to be taken to the white connex at the recycle center. If you need assistance at the recycle center or getting your recyclables to the recycle center; stop by the CIV office or call at 767-5505 and talk with Brian Willard or Pat Warren.

Waste-Oil Furnace

We are still in need of waste oil for the Fire Hall waste oil furnace. The types of oil the furnace takes are used engine oil, transmission fluid, and number 2 diesel oil. If you change your vehicle oil please call the CIV office at 767-5505 ask for Brian Willard or Don Hotch Jr. and we can come and get your waste oil for the furnace.

Recycling Tips

How to recycle:

Aluminum Cans: Rinse, drain, and put in Bin for transport to recycling center. (No foil / Pie Plates, cat food cans etc.)

Tin Cans: Rinsed, flattened, and labels off

Plastic Bottles & Jugs: p¹ – Green & Clear Soda Bottles & Jugs (All containers need to be rinsed out and lids removed)

 P^2 – All Colors including white (All containers need to be rinsed out and lids removed)

Cloudy Plastic Jugs.

Glass can be taken to Bigfoot. Glass needs to be rinsed. There is a fenced area behind Bigfoot where you can throw your unwanted glass containers.

Used lead-acid batteries can be taken to Bigfoot. Bigfoot now takes used lead-acid batteries at no charge.

Just a Reminder:

Please make sure your household trash & garbage are in plastic garbage bags before putting it in the bear proof containers. If the bear proof container is full please let us know. We do have replacement bags for the bear containers.

Electronic Waste (E-Waste)

E-Waste is used computers, cell phones, TVs, and VCRs. Some materials, such as lead, nickel, cadmium and mercury could pose threats to human health and the environment if mismanaged at their end-of-life. Keeping used electronics out of the landfills, to recover materials and the environmental impacts and energy demands from mining and manufacturing will lengthen the life of the landfill. Recycling electronics recovers valuable materials and as a result, we reduce greenhouse emissions, reduce pollution, save energy and save resources by extracting fewer raw materials from the earth.

Students can choose to learn Photoshop, Illustrator, Outlook, Microsoft Excel, Microsoft Publisher, Microsoft Word, ITunes and much more. They cover a variety of topics — including surprising ones like public speaking and project management.

If a student is preparing for an internship or job that requires specific software, Lynda can be a helpful place to start learning. Lynda.com helps keep computer skills current as technology changes. Lynda.com is available to all residents of Klukwan and clients of the 477 program. Only five people can use this license at a time and priority will be given to 477 clients.

To use Lynda.com come to the village office or call to sign up. Please ask to speak to Carrie. Once you have signed up to the program you can log in to the online library from any internet-connected computer.

Green Cleaning Tip

Wood Cleaning formula

Combine 1/4 cup white distilled vinegar,14 cup water, 1/2 teaspoon liquid vegetable oil-based soap, a few drops of olive oil, and 3—4 drops of essential oil (optional) in a bowl. Saturate a sponge with the mixture, squeeze out the excess, and test wood surface. Rinse sponge in warm water in between washes.

To remove water spots on wood, allow the spots to dry out completely. Apply real mayonnaise over stain and let stand for at least an hour. Clean and buff with a clean rag.
